

## Simple Overview of COVID-19 Guidance – Past and Current

	Past Guidance	Current Guidance
<b>Rapid Tests</b>	<p>All employees, visitors, and contractors were required to use rapid tests every 3 days. This was done to screen for asymptomatic COVID-19</p> <p>Positive COVID test results require the employee to not report to work – or immediately leave work.</p> <p>Rapid Tests used by all employees in the 10 days following a close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 as a screening tool prior to entering a Christian Horizons Location.</p> <p>Rapid tests used in Ontario after employees developed symptoms as part of the return-to-work guidance.</p>	<p>Christian Horizons will continue to provide Rapid Tests for employees when they are needed (e.g. required with any COVID symptoms). All rapid tests results will be recorded through the <a href="#">link</a> on CHConnect and reported to the next level supervisor.</p> <p>Positive COVID test results require the employee to not report to work – or immediately leave work.</p> <p>Rapid Tests continue to be used in the 10 days following a close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 as a screening tool prior to entering a Christian Horizons Location.</p> <p>Rapid tests <b>continue to be used</b> in Ontario when employees develop symptoms of COVID-19 as part of the return-to-work guidance.</p>
<b>Masks</b>	<p>Universal (i.e. at all times) masking and N95's used during outbreaks</p>	<p>Universal (i.e. at all times) use of masks is a district decision based on COVID-19 trends and local Public Health guidance.</p> <p>N95 masks and full PPE continue to be used during all outbreaks.</p>
<b>Screening</b>	<p><b>“Active Screening”</b> Employees asked everyone entering the location a series of questions, including a list of symptoms, to approve them for entering the location.</p>	<p><b>“Passive Screening”</b> Everyone entering a location reviews the “Symptom Self Check Poster”. If none of the listed symptoms/questions apply they are permitted to enter the location.</p>
	<p><b>*No Changes to Return to Work Guidance Therefore, the following Guidance remains.</b></p>	
<b>Return to work</b>	<p><u>Saskatchewan</u> employees with symptoms of COVID-19 remain off work until they have symptoms improving for 24hrs.</p> <p><u>Ontario</u>, employees remain off work until 24hrs of symptom improvement (48hrs if vomiting and diarrhea) <u>and one</u> of the following occur:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 10 days have passed from symptom onset <b>OR</b></li> <li>• 2 negative Rapid Antigen Tests 24hours apart <b>OR</b></li> <li>• A negative PCR test.</li> </ul>	<p><u>Saskatchewan</u> employees with symptoms of COVID-19 remain off work until they have symptoms improving for 24hrs.</p> <p><u>Ontario</u>, employees remain off work until 24hrs of symptom improvement (48hrs if vomiting and diarrhea) <u>and one</u> of the following occur:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 10 days have passed from symptom onset <b>OR</b></li> <li>• 2 negative Rapid Antigen Tests 24hours apart <b>OR</b></li> <li>• A negative PCR test.</li> </ul>
