Rapid Tests	All employees, visitors, and contractors were required to use rapid tests every 3 days. This was done to screen for asymptomatic COVID-19	Christian Horizons will continue to provide Rapid Tests for employees when they are needed (e.g. required with any COVID symptoms). All rapid tests results will be recorded through the <a href="Link">Link</a> on CHConnect and reported to the next level supervisor.

Masks	Universal (i.e. at all times) masking and N95's used during outbreaks	Universal (i.e. at all times) use of masks is a district decision based on COVID-19 trends and local Public Health guidance.  N95 masks and full PPE continue to be used during all outbreaks.
Screening	"Active Screening"  Employees asked everyone entering the location a series of questions, including a list of symptoms, to approve them for entering the location.	"Passive Screening"  Everyone entering a location reviews the "Symptom Self Check Poster". If none of the listed symptoms/questions apply they are permitted to enter the location.
